This group exhibition features works by Jen Aitken, Josée Aubin Ouellette, Liza Eurich, Jenine Marsh, Derrick Piens and Beth Stuart.

There is no There refers to Gertrude Stein's quote regarding Oakland, CA and its relation to San Francisco, CA: "there is no there, there." This statement confronts twentieth-century concepts of suburban expansion along with the simultaneous loss of industry.
