Dear Julie Dring,

I am writing to apply to become a member of the Hamilton Artists Inc.'s Board of Directors following your recommendation. I am currently in the final stages of my doctorate in Art History at Concordia University and reside in Hamilton. I have been active in various capacities on many different committees, including acting as volunteer, treasurer, chair of different organizational committees, and president. As a consequence, I understand how community organizations contribute to the development of culture. For this reason, I wish to take participate in the Hamilton Artists Inc. Board. Artist-run centres play a crucial part in supporting artists and fostering spaces that challenge our current understanding of contemporary art discourse. I believe that my committee experiences as well as my museum and gallery work will be a valuable asset to the organization.

While in Montreal as part of the residency requirements of my PhD, I participated in a number of initiatives including Hyopthèses Symposia, Art History Graduate Student Association (AHGSA), Speaking of Photography Lecture Series, and at Optica. My roles included, respectively, communications chair, treasurer and president, organizer, and archivist. Through this work I have gained insight into the administrative needs of an array of roles. Additionally, I have gained an understanding of the importance of collaboration and compromise in the decision-making process. This facilitates a happier and more functional committee, allowing for resources to be better directed toward programing.

As President of AHGSA, I helped create new projects to better support student needs on both personal and academic fronts. We introduced breast-feeding areas in department spaces, held office

hours for students, expended the graduate student space, advocated for students regarding payment allocations, and organized a conference attended by graduate students from across North America.

Through my work on the abovementioned committees and others, I have come to recognize the importance of listening to individual needs and creating safe spaces for people to voice their concerns and ideas. In my opinion, this is key to forming innovative programming. I have read the Hamilton Artists Inc. mission statement and values and agree with the stated principles. It is exciting to see the organization take an active role in facilitating these changes in the city and the Canadian art scene more widely.

Using my skills developed in previous positions on Boards, I am confident that I will be able to make a positive contribution to the Board. On the other hand, this opportunity is exciting to me as I still have much to learn about Hamilton's art community. As a newcomer to the city, participating on the board will allow me to better understand the active scene here and help me integrate into the city I intend on calling home.
