


Ayda Ghaffari

Ayda Ghaffari is an artist and educator. After receiving her BFA from Ryerson University in Performance Production, she found herself immersed in children's theatre, designing and creating the set and costumes for the plays. Ayda has been teaching visual arts to children aged 3 to 13 for the past eight years, which she currently does at the Hamilton Conservatory for the Arts. After graduating from Brock University, she is now a member of the HWDSB, bringing the Hamilton community spirit, the environment, and the arts to the classroom and the curriculum.


